# WHAT TO (OR NOT TO) WEAR

## ATTIRE FOR BUSINESS PROFESSIONAL EVENTS AND INTERVIEWS

### WHAT TO WEAR

- Well-groomed hairstyle
- Simple patterned tie
- Dark-colored, conservative suit
- Polished dress shoes with matching dark socks
- Light-colored dress shirt or blouse with undershirt
- Subtle makeup and jewelry
- Skirt or dress at appropriate length
- Closed-toe shoes with a conservative heel

### WHAT NOT TO WEAR

- Excessive jewelry
- Tight or revealing clothes
- Flashy accessories
- Ruffles, lace or shiny fabric
- Sneakers or flip flops
- Sunglasses or hats
- Baggy pockets, shorts or jeans
- Holes or rips

### Business Casual

Appropriate business casual dress typically includes slacks or khakis, dress shirt or blouse, open-collared polo shirt, sweater or skirt (at knee-length or below), and loafers or dress shoes that cover all or most of the foot.



#### Business Casual Is

- Colored, button-down shirts tucked in
- Blouses or shirts with a conservative cut
- Sweaters or cardigans
- Khaki or dark pants with a belt
- Skirts or dresses that fall below the fingertips

#### Business Casual Is NOT

- Flip flops or sandals
- Gym/athletic attire
- Jeans
- Shorts

### Business Formal

The professional standard is to wear a two-piece, matching suit in gray, navy, or black.



#### Business Formal Is

- Matching suit
- Dark colors
- Closed-toe shoe/low heel
- Button-down shirt
- Formal blouse

#### Business Formal Is NOT

- Open-toe shoes
- Khaki pants
- Short Sleeve jackets
- Low-cut clothing
